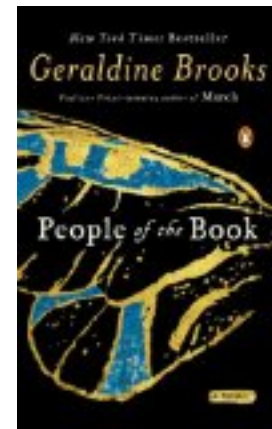
## The Gulag in Soviet History @ Lakeland Library

### Food for Thought . . . In Support of Student Learning



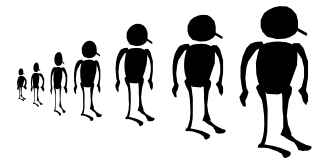
