

Lakeland Library, Exciting Changes for 2006-07!

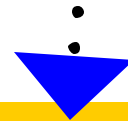
Two New Part-time Reference Librarians:

Holly and Michael replace part-time reference librarians Tricia Lunt and Michele Allen, who have left us for full-time employment.

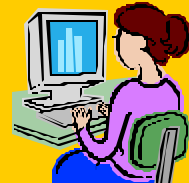

The College has leased new copiers for the campus. The library was provided copiers with coin-ops. Previously, copies were made on the "honor system" and were 5 cents each. The College has changed the price to 10 cents per copy. The new copiers are designed specifically for library use—meaning that they can copy into the spine of a book and can handle large numbers of copies.

For faculty bringing entire classes to the library to make copies, students should be prepared to feed the coin-op. The coin-op will take bills up to \$20, but provides **change in coin, only.**

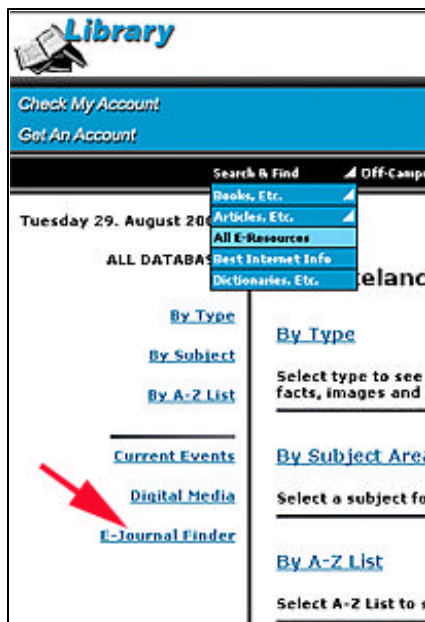

The Move from Print to Electronic Journals, by Kate Kendall



Each summer, the reference librarians review OhioLINK's full-text periodical holdings. We then apply the library's selection criteria to determine if the use of the paper version is adequate to outweigh its cost. Consideration is given to discontinue subscriptions to a print versions when full-text is available.

The advantages to electronic journals are twofold: they can be keyword searched from within the database itself or from Google Scholar, and they are available 24/7. Researchers will not only do a more thorough search but will be able to access the article from any computer connected to the Internet.

For assistance in finding a particular title online, ask one of our reference librarians for help or check OhioLINK's journal holdings using EJournal Finder. From the Library Homepage, click on Search & Find, All E-Resources, E-Journal Finder. E-Journal Finder will locate which database contains the journal and provide a link. Most database search engines allow users to select only scholarly and/or only full-text; Electronic Journal Center is all scholarly, all full-text, all the time. Please contact a reference librarian at 440.525-7425 for any assistance you may require for yourself or your students.

Periodical Title Changes, by Linda Glasser

The periodical titles listed in the attached PDF file will be undergoing changes this academic year. Although these titles will no longer be available in current, print format in the library, many of the titles are now available in full-text, electronic format. No longer receiving the print format, or changing from print to electronic format, will save the library over \$4,700 in 2007. Odyssey Electronic Document Delivery Service, by Ellen Strand

The Interlibrary Loan department has a new electronic document delivery service called Odyssey, for sending and receiving periodical articles. With Odyssey, articles can be received the same day they are requested. The article can then be attached to the e-mail of the person requesting the articles. The person requesting the article does not have to come to the library to pick it up. The advantage is that now you can receive your article via e-mail even when the Lakeland Library is not open. As always, requests must be placed with the Reference Librarians.

On the theory that a picture is worth a thousand words, the library's redesigned homepage is pictured above. The links to the Library Homepage, the College Homepage as well as to Library Account Information, the Search Now! Box and the Menus, display at the top of every page.

Use the drop-down menus to find what you need:

- **Search & Find** for books, articles, websites, research links
- **Off-Campus Access** to login or for help logging in
- **Library Services** for Course Reserves, ILL, Faculty and Staff services
- **Guides & Help** for online help, subject guides, writing & citing, reference assistance
- **About the Library** for hours, locations, policies, maps, contacts

The Library Homepage acts as a virtual library making it easy for anyone with access to a computer on the Internet to use as many library services as possible at their convenience.

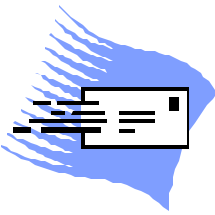
Easy to Locate Newspapers and Oversized Periodicals, by Cori Tatulinski

During the summer break, the hanging files that contain the newspapers and oversized periodicals were re-organized. Color coding of the folders has been improved by separating similar colors. Entire titles have been re-arranged to fit in one section; no more "spilling" into the next section of hanging files. Complete collections of a newspaper title, such as **The News-Herald**, now begin at the top of a section and end on the bottom bar of the same section. These changes should make locating newspapers and oversized periodicals a little easier for students, faculty and staff.



Get E-Noticed @ The Library, by Linda Glasser

Employees and students can now receive notices from the library by e-mail. Stop by the circulation desk or call 440.525.7424 to have your Lakeland e-mail address added to your library account. When your Lakeland e-mail address is added, you will then begin to receive library notices through e-mail. This saves the library the cost of paper and postage as well as staff time.



Faculty have begun to receive notification of requested materials through their Lakeland e-mail. When new books or media materials are received by the library, faculty requesting the materials are sent an electronic copy of the record found in the library catalog. This e-mail notice alerts faculty that the new materials are now in the library and are available for faculty and student use.
