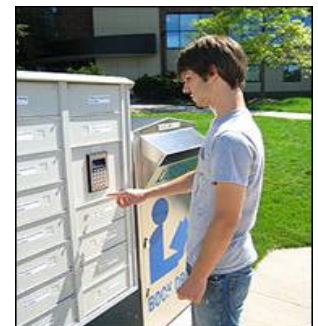
Library Offers Curbside Pickup!

For your convenience, you may now request that books be placed in our new curbside pickup, located along the driveway by the nursing parking lot (north of H building).

When requesting a book via OhioLINK, "Library Main Curbside" is listed as a pickup location—in additional to Lakeland Main, Lakeland East and West. Library users may request their materials be placed in the curbside locker, checked out and ready to go! Each locker compartment is programmed via the web and opened by keying in your Lakeland ID number. An adjacent book drop allows for curbside return of materials.

Library Reserves, by Judy Schmidt

With the start of fall semester, consider how **electronic reserves** can help you and your students. Course materials such as syllabus, class notes, sample tests, sample assignments, supplemental reading, and more can be placed on electronic reserve. Power point presentations can also be placed on electronic reserve allowing students an opportunity to review class notes 24/7. Electronic reserves save instructor's **time** distributing items in class, **time** taking items to the print shop and **printing costs** for Lakeland. Materials can be brought to the library in **paper form, on a CD or disk, or sent by e-mail.**

The library also has selected **textbooks on reserve**. This reserve is frequently used and appreciated by students. Purchasing a textbook can be a hardship for some students, and on occasion the book store supply is not available. Having a textbook to use in the library is helpful. If instructors have extra copies of the textbook currently being used in their class, please consider placing it on textbook reserve. Local Resources Continue to Grow @ Your Library, by Linda Glasser



The library collection of on-site resource materials continued to grow during the 2006-2007 Academic Year. Over 1800 new items were added to the library's print collection. Approximately 60,000 print items are available in the library for student and faculty use.

In addition to these on-site resources, we now have a new on-line resource available from on or off campus. Over the summer, 164 Oxford Reference Ebooks were added to our catalog. Among the new ebooks are full text of dictionaries, general reference, language reference and subject specific reference works, from Oxford University Press.

Book Discussion Group @ Your Library

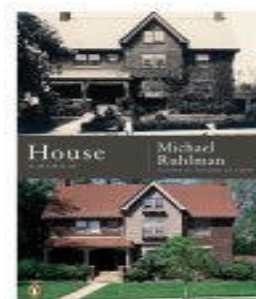
Please join the staff of the Lakeland Library in our lively discussions of many of today's popular titles.

COURTESY NOTICES @ Lakeland Library

Lakeland Library is sending email reminders to library users before materials are due, to remind users to renew or return their materials. These COURTESY NOTICES are sent three days before the materials are due. Courtesy notices are sent to Lakeland email addresses. A link on the email allows users to connect to their online library account and renew materials online.

LONG TERM LOANS

In keeping with the Library's mission to make information accessible to all our users, the Library does not grant long term loans on materials. Materials are checked out to faculty, staff, administration, students and community borrowers for up to three weeks. Renewals are granted, as long as no requests have been placed for the material. Please see your Library Liaison to discuss materials located in your section of the collection.

OhioLINK FINES

All Library users borrowing materials through the OhioLINK system are responsible for all fines and late fees as a result of returning materials past their due date. To avoid fines and late fees, renew or return materials before their due date. You may renew by phone at x 7424, from the library homepage "Check My Account" or in person. As always, renewals are granted as long as no requests have been placed for the materials.
